Dr Anne Deighton is a University Lecturer at the University of Oxford, UK, and a fellow of Wolfson College. She is the Course Director of the University's two year full-time Masters Programme in European Politics and Society, based in the University's Centre for European Politics, Economies and Society. She holds a personal 'chaire' Jean Monnet in European Integration history. She has previously been the National Westminster Bank Senior Research Fellow at St Antony's College, University of Oxford (1991-7), and has been a lecturer at the University of Reading (1987-1991), and the Open University. She holds degrees from the University of Oxford, and the University of Reading.

She has held visiting professorships at the Universities of Paris I, la Sorbonne; and Paris III, Sorbonne-la-Nouvelle, France. She is a Council member of the Royal Institute of International Affairs (Chatham House), London, and as one of two British representatives on the Groupe de Liaison d'historiens auprès de la Communauté Européenne.

She has published extensively on the cold war, European Integration, and on British foreign policy. Her major publications include:
